





### **Strategy insights**

Going forward, the Management is focusing on a few strategic pillars to further accelerate growth and realize more value ...

- 1 Continuation of the focus on commercial uplift, with aggressive push on sales and enhancement of hotels figures
- 2 Continuation of the focus on the operational efficiency
- <sup>3</sup>We project the paradigm shift for valuation to be realized through the recognition of land bank value, which can be achieved through two main drivers; land sales and deals on yielding assets
- 4 Focus on JVs to co-finance new hotel builds to further enhance cash flow outlook and achieve higher acceleration
- 5 On the short term, the focus on land bank monetization should be through transformative deals rather than land sales. The impact of projected partnership deals is expected to yield higher impact levels over time

Our 2023 focus will be on business performance and strongly on sales and hotel revenues, but we will keep pushing some core initiatives key to our continuous long-term growth

ODE performance enhancement has been achieved through Management's focus on four key transformation work streams



Commercial uplift efforts focused on enhancing sales performance through initiative that promote higher pricing and larger volumes of sales across destinations



#### **Commercial uplift**

#### **Real Estate:**

- Establishment of the Sales' Excellence Department on the corporate level, with the mandate to enhance sales' performance & process
   The Sales' Excellence Department has implemented several initiatives that had a significant impact on sales, such as:
  - o Implementation of **new incentive programs** to reward high performers and penalize under performers
  - Design of **new commission schemes** with the purpose of reducing cost of sales
  - Established the International Sales Team based in Dubai to tap into new markets
  - Overhauled the CRM for sales teams and built a robust sales' analytics function
  - Impact on sales:
    - Total real estate sales grew to reach ~EGP 11.1 bn in 2022 compared to ~EGP 0.8 bn in 2016
       This was driven by the growth in sold units from 202 units in 2015 to 1,455 units in 2021, and a price increases
       reaching ~170% in some destinations/unit types
    - **Savings on the commission payouts** exceeding 50% for some destination products

#### Hospitality:

- Enacted a new performance management model that incentivizes direct sales and higher pricing
  - Impact: Revenues grew from ~ EGP 576 mil in 2015 to EGP 1.5bn in 2019 and EGP 1.0 bil in 9M 2022, despite the headwinds of Covid-19, with a higher focus on direct sales which rose from 23% to 35%

In its first 2 years, the new management affected several initiatives across different functions such as Technical, Digital, and Finance operations to alleviate ODE overall performance



#### **Operational efficiency**

#### **Technical Operations:**

- Establishment of the Technical CoE on with the mandate of optimizing construction costs & implementing best practices
- Centralization of all procurement activities, in addition to establishing the Technical CoE with a focus on value engineering

#### **Digital transformation:**

- Started implementing a digital transformation program aiming to maximize operational efficiency, enable the commercial uplift, and enhance cyber security, initiatives include:
  - Implemented new ERP systems some of our destinations
  - Launch a new, integrated Hotel Management System
  - Implement new **procurement system** covering the whole Group
  - Upgrading some of **ODE's websites and apps** (Gouna and Makadi)
  - Launching Retail Management Systems in the destinations
  - **Smart cities initiative** (piloted in O West destination)

#### **Finance operations:**

- Introduced a new budgeting and planning framework supported by a corporate-wide ERP system
- Introduced new business processes for investment assessment to ensure value maximization for deployment of the Group's assets

Human capital has been a key transformational focus over the past two years, with the focus of attracting and assigning the right talent pool in addition to several strategic initiatives



#### Human capital

#### Hiring and talent management

- Accelerated hiring operations, including:
  - o 7 new Chief officers with diverse, extensive experience in real estate, investment banking and consulting
  - o 33 top caliber employees in top management positions across destinations and on the corporate level
  - Re-shuffled some of our destination CEOs to employ their different strengths in advancing commercial performance

#### **Strategic initiatives**

- Implementation of new performance management and incentive program to incentivize high performance and uphold meritocracy
- Realigned job positions & restructured job grading across the Group, ensuring salary alignment to market levels
- Completed a full succession plan covering all critical positions across the group
- Design of a comprehensive L&D framework for the Group and upgrade of HR policies and procedures

The management has been also focusing on strategic deals and transactions that would ensure value maximization for the Group



### El Gouna, Egypt – ODE's Flagship Project World-Class Destination on the Egyptian Red Sea Coast

Total land area:

36.9 million sqm

The town offers a range of facilities such as a hospital, two golf courses, four marinas, four schools, a library, co-working spaces and a university.

### Highlights

- New real estate sales during Q3 22 grew by 19.9% to EGP 1.2bn vs. EGP 1.0bn in Q3 21. That brings our 9M 22 sales value to EGP 3.2bn up 4.8% vs. EGP 3.0bn in 9M 21.
- During 2022, we increased our USD real estate cap rate from EGP 19.75 to close the year at a cap rate of EGP 25.5.
- Continued to accelerate real estate construction activity and managed to deliver all 285 planned units during FY 2022.
- Hotels' occupancy levels increased by 25ppt from 45% during FY 21 to 70% in FY 22. Foreigners represented 78% of our total hotels' occupancy during FY 22.
- Successfully finalized the renovation process of turning Bellevue Hotel into Chedi Hotel. The hotel was opened mid-Dec. 2022.
- Finalizing the renovation process which have started during 2022 across Ocean View, Steigenberger & Sheraton Hotels, with plans to be finalized during Q1 23.
- Inaugurated the first building of the Uri-Schule El Gouna campus. The Swiss school is the first in Mena and Africa to be directly supervised by Swiss authorities.





### Highlights

- Received a preliminary non-binding offer (NBO) from SODIC for the potential acquisition of the entire share capital of Orascom for Real Estate (ORE), the owner of O West. The NBO includes an indicative & preliminary equity value purchase price of EGP 2.46bn for 100% of ORE.
- O West continues to affirm its leading position in West Cairo. 9M 22 sales value reached EGP 3.5bn, a 50.1% increase vs. 9M 21.
- Increased our real estate average selling prices by 23.7% to EGP 37,039/sqm vs. 9M 21.
- We are speeding up our construction pace, whereby we completed the construction of 444 villas and are progressing with the construction of 1,015 apartments and 236 townhomes, with plans to start delivering some units in Q1 2023 (710 units).
- Started the construction of 119 units in the O West Business District (OBD) by the end of July 2022. Construction work at the O West Club is progressing at a steady pace. The club will be partially open by Q3-23.
- In July 2022, we signed EGP 1.5bn facility agreement to partially finance the development & help accelerate the construction of the launched phases until 9M 2022 EGP 280mn were withdrawn.

### Makadi Heights, Egypt The First Gated Community In The Heart Of Hurghada

Makadi Heights is the ultimate family vacation destination. The project offers all the amenities to keep homeowners entertained: a beach club, a retail centre, clubhouse & an outdoor entertainment zone and pre-school.

- Real estate sales started to pick up again during Q3 2022. In Q3 22, real estate sales increased by 12.6% to EGP 304.9mn. While 9M 22 real estate sales reached EGP 609.4mn (9M 21: EGP 854.7mn). We purposefully slowed sales until we resolved the land concern issue with the TDA in June 2022.
- In Q3 2022, we launched a new real estate project "Ledge" with total inventory value of EGP 2.5bn.
- Managed to deliver all 248 planned units by the end of June 2022.
- Opened "Bayou Lagoon", spreading across 7k sqm and was planned to operate in 2024.
- Managed to sign a partnership with Metropolitan Schools for Educational Services, to open its first branch for preprimary education in the Red Sea, with an EGP 15.0mn investment cost.

The town offers a marina, a wide range of facilities including a medical centre, child day-care services, & a vibrant up-town centre.

- Taba Hotels witnessed a strong summer season, reporting a 52% occupancy rate during Q3 22 vs. 21% in Q3 21. While the overall 9M 22 occupancy rate reached 28%, up from 10% in 9M 21.
- For the first time since 2019, the hotels reported a positive GOP of EGP 22.5mn in 9M 2022 vs. a negative EGP 20.9mn in 9M 2021.
- To date, only two hotels out of the six hotels are open (Strand Hotel & Mosaique Hotel) with 929 rooms, with plans to open another hotel by 2023.
- Our short-to-medium-term strategy for Taba Heights remains focused on developing and promoting existing and potential business opportunities with local operators, in addition to several European tour operators to secure a steady flow of business for the hotels.


